This is the largest *Parabola* issue yet, offering twelve fascinating articles, ten beautiful and fun new problems, and yet more problems, and the winners' list, from the 63rd Annual UNSW School Mathematics Competition.

This year's volume of *Parabola* offered the largest number of published articles (32) and, most likely, this year saw the greatest number of submissions (86). Based on these numbers, the acceptance rate of *Parabola* articles is $32/86 \approx 37\%$, or close to a third. Of the articles that eventually get published, most are well-written in their submitted form, especially given that many are written by first-time authors with no prior LaTeX experience. Even so, most articles undergo extensive revisions from initial submission draft to the final published, to elevate them in content and presentation where possible.

It is a tremendous pleasure to see *Parabola* continue to grow both in size and quality, as the growing submission numbers make it possible to raise quality requirements. I hope that you are enjoying this growth too, as reader, and please feel more than welcome to contribute to the quality of *Parabola* too, as author!
